CiNoMatic, NoMa's Free Outdoor Movie Series, Returns on Wednesday Nights at Alethia Tanner Park from May 8 - June 5, 2024

April 4, 2024 (Washington, DC) – CiNoMatic, NoMa's free outdoor movie series at Alethia Tanner Park, is returning for the sixth season this spring. Every Wednesday night from May 8 through June 5, the NoMa Business Improvement District (BID) will show free movies under the stars.

The theme for the spring 2024 CiNoMatic season is "Epic Expeditions." Whether you're drawn to daring journeys to distant lands or thrilling treks through uncharted territories, this season's diverse lineup offers films is as follows:

May 8: National Treasure

May 15: The Lost City

May 22: O Brother, Where Art Thou?

May 29: Indiana Jones and the Kingdom of the Crystal Skull

June 5: The Goonies with musical rescore by [Shaolin Jazz](#), who will bring their unique and immersive "Can I Kick It?" concept blending hip hop, funk and soul tunes to create a live remix of the original Goonies soundtrack to fit the action on the screen.

"We look forward to bringing the community together again this spring on Wednesday nights at Alethia Tanner Park for the sixth season of CiNoMatic," said Maura Brophy, President & CEO of the NoMa BID. "CiNoMatic movies at Alethia Tanner Park make for one of DC's best outdoor movies experiences. With the addition of Shaolin Jazz for this season's finale, CiNoMatic moviegoers can expect an exciting fusion of sound and film, making for a truly distinctive and entertaining evening."

The spring 2024 "Epic Expeditions" CiNoMatic movie lineup was determined through a community vote in March 2024, with more than 900 people participating. The selected movies feature a diverse lineup of action-packed adventure films, all rated PG or PG-13.

CiNoMatic movies begin at sunset, with seating on the lawn at Alethia Tanner Park opening one hour prior to showtime. Movie-goers are encouraged to bring their own blankets and folding chairs, and to arrive early for lawn games and free weekly giveaways. Food and drinks will be available for purchase from local food truck partners. Dogs on-leash are welcome.
